Call Overview

To date 39 have registered for the listening sessions: 13 local government from Volusia, 21 Brevard local government, 15 for economic workshop. Discussion of if we should we post on the RPC Facebook about the workshops. Decided that will wait until April to post on Facebook so most of the registration can fill up instead of posting sooner. Walk-ins will be allowed the day of the workshop. April there will be another save the date sent out to registrants. Attendees will get name-tags the day of the workshops and will be assigned specific tables to start the sessions; walk-ins the day of will be randomly placed amongst the tables. Those who are not involved in running a table on the committee will be able to participate in the workshop. The Icebreaker will be 10 minutes. Discussion on Icebreaker questions on resiliency and if they were too heavy for the icebreaker. Decided we should have a more creative icebreaker with lighter questions. Table facilitators will be facilitating the icebreaker. Question if we need the definition of resiliency? Posters with our definitions and goals will be placed around the room packets will be made for the attendees with the information. Sign-in will be 8:30 am to give people more time to sign-in and network. Workshop will start right at 9:00 am. There was discussion on the break-out sessions and how long they should be/ how many there should be. After looking at some of the questions, it was decided that 30 minutes may be the best option for length of the sessions and just having two sessions. There will be 5 minutes for each group to report out after the break-outs. The idea to have notepads and pens on the tables at the break-outs will be implemented for people to write notes in case they do not get the chance to share ideas during the break-outs. The group went over each question section for the break-outs. For the Planning section we will address response and recovery. Thomas will ultimately decide the wording for some of the questions. There will be more added to this section about SLR, inundation risk, and solutions for them- what are the challenges to dealing with coastal resiliency? For the Local Fiscal Perspective section there will be a definition added for stressors and shock. Discussed the addition of long term sustainable financing and if they are aware of costs over a long-term period, will potentially add this to the questions. For the Social questions we will add the question about what can be leveraged to fill the needs of low-income and homeless communities. There was discussion about Title 6 and what to include since there is no way of knowing where funds will be coming from. Decided there will be an environmental resiliency question added about low-income communities. Sarah will develop a question revolving around this idea.
